PUBLIC UTILITIES COMMISSION OF THE STATE OF CALIFORNIA

SUBJECT: Revisions to Gas and Electric Schedules in Compliance with Assembly Bill 2857

San Diego Gas & Electric Company (SDG&E) hereby submits for approval by the California Public Utilities Commission (Commission) revisions to SDG&E's electric and gas tariffs, as shown on Attachments A and B.

PURPOSE

This filing revises gas and electric Schedules GM, G-CARE and E-CARE in compliance with Assembly Bill (AB) 2857, which amended Public Utilities Code Section 739.5 to grant eligibility for the California Alternative Rates for Energy (CARE) program to residential users of gas and electric service who are submetered and reside in master-metered multi-family dwelling units or mobile home parks in which not all of the individual units are submetered. SDG&E currently complies with the new provisions of 739.5, however it is submitting the following revisions to include clarifying language in compliance with AB 2857 and Ordering Paragraph (OP) 105 of (D.08-11-031).

BACKGROUND

On September 28, 2008, the State Legislature passed AB 2857, which amended Section 739.5 of the Public Utilities Code by adding the following section to the code:

(h) Notwithstanding any other provision of law or decision of the commission, the commission shall not deny eligibility for the California Alternative Rates for Energy (CARE) program, created pursuant to Section 739.1, for a residential user of gas or electric service who is a submetered resident or tenant served by a master-meter customer on the basis that some residential units in the master-meter customer's mobilehome park, apartment building, or similar residential complex do not receive gas or electric service through a submetered system.

AB 2857 requires the Commission to grant eligibility for the CARE program to residential users of gas service who are submetered and reside in master-metered multi-family dwellings or mobile home parks in which not all of the individual units are submetered.

On November 10, 2008, the Commission issued D.08-11-031 in Application (A.) 08-05-025 with an effective date of November 6, 2008. OP 105 of D.08-11-031 directs the IOUs to update their tariffs in order to comply with the amendment to AB2857 (Lieber) within 60 days of the effective date of the decision.

SDG&E currently complies with AB 2857 granting eligibility for the CARE program to residential users of gas and electric service who are submetered and reside in master-metered multi-family dwelling or mobile home parks. However, for clarification and consistency with the proposed tariffs of Southern California Gas Company, language has been added to gas and electric schedules GM, G-CARE and E-CARE to specify that residential users who are submetered are eligible to receive the CARE discount.

EFFECTIVE DATE

SDG&E believes this filing is subject to Energy Division disposition and should be classified as Tier 2 (effective after staff approval) pursuant to GO 96-B. SDG&E respectfully requests that this filing be approved effective February 4, 2009, 30 days from the date filed.

PROTEST

Anyone may protest this Advice Letter to the California Public Utilities Commission. The protest must state the grounds upon which it is based, including such items as financial and service impact, and should be submitted expeditiously. The protest must be made in writing and must be received within 20 days of the date this Advice Letter was filed with the Commission. There is no restriction on who may file a protest. CALIFORNIA ALTERNATE RATES FOR ENERGY

APPLICABILITY

This schedule provides a California Alternate Rates for Energy (CARE) discount to each of the following types of customers listed below that meet the requirements for CARE eligibility as defined in Rule 1, Definitions, and herein, and is taken in conjunction with the customer's otherwise applicable service schedule.

- 1) Customers residing in a permanent single-family accommodation, separately metered by the Utility.
- 2) Multi-family dwelling units and mobile home parks supplied through one meter on a single premises where the individual unit is submetered.
- 3) Non-profit group living facilities.
- 4) Agricultural employee housing facilities.

TERRITORY

Within the entire territory served by the Utility.

DISCOUNT

Qualified low income customers and living facilities will receive a 20% CARE discount on all customer, demand, and energy charges on their otherwise applicable service schedule. The discount will be based on the total bill as calculated for bundled service customers and applied by way of a reduction to the distribution rate component. In addition, the customer will be exempt from paying the CARE surcharge of \$0.00241 kWh.

SPECIAL CONDITIONS

ALL CUSTOMERS

- 1. Applicable Conditions. All special conditions contained in the customer's otherwise applicable schedule are applicable to service under this schedule.
- 2. Application and Eligibility Declaration. An application and eligibility declaration, on a form authorized by the Commission, is required for service under the CARE program unless otherwise authorized by the Commission. Renewal of a customer's eligibility declaration, also referred to as recertification, will be required at the request of the Utility.
- 3. Commencement of CARE Discount. Eligible customers shall begin receiving the CARE discount no later than one billing period after receipt of a completed and approved application by the Utility or as may otherwise be authorized by the Commission.

The qualified customer will receive a 20% CARE discount on all customer, commodity, and transportation charges on their otherwise applicable service schedule. In addition, the customer will not pay the CARE portion of the Public Purpose Programs Surcharge as specified in Schedule G-PPPS.

SPECIAL CONDITIONS

ALL CUSTOMERS

- 1. Applicable Conditions. All special conditions contained in the customer's otherwise applicable schedule are applicable to service under this schedule.
- 2. Application and Eligibility Declaration. An application and eligibility declaration, on a form authorized by the Commission, is required for service under the CARE program unless otherwise authorized by the Commission. Renewal of a customer's eligibility declaration, also referred to as recertification, will be required at the request of the Utility.

SCHEDULE GM

MULTI-FAMILY NATURAL GAS SERVICE
(Includes Rates for GM, GM-C and GTC/GTCA)

APPLICABILITY

This schedule is closed as of July 13, 1978 for gas service to: (a) new residential Mobilehome Parks where such Mobilehome Park tenants use gas directly in gas appliances in each occupancy; and (b) new Multi-family Accommodation structures where such multi-unit tenants use gas directly in gas appliances in each occupancy and which requires venting, except where equipped with only vented decorative appliances.

The GM rate is applicable to natural gas procurement service for Multi-family Accommodations, including service to common central space and/or water heating facilities, supplied through one meter on a single premises in accordance with the provisions of Rule 19. This schedule also applies to accommodations defined in Rule 1 as Residential Hotels.

The GM-C, cross-over rate, is a core procurement option for residential core transportation customers with annual consumption over 50,000 therms as set forth in Special Condition 11.

The GTC/GTCA rate is applicable to intrastate gas transportation-only services, as set forth in Special Condition 12.

This schedule is applicable to income-qualified households that meet the requirements for the California Alternate Rates for Energy (CARE) as set forth in Schedule G-CARE.

Non-profit group living facilities taking service under this schedule may be eligible for a 20% low-income rate discount on their bill, if such facilities qualify to receive service under the terms and conditions of Schedule G-CARE.

Agricultural Employee Housing Facilities, as defined in Schedule G-CARE, may qualify for a 20% CARE discount on the bill if all eligibility criteria set forth in Form 142-4032 or Form 142-4035 is met.

Multi-family Accommodations built prior to July 13, 1978 and served under GM rate may also be eligible for service under Schedule GS. If an eligible Multi-family Accommodation or residential hotel served under GM rate converts to an applicable submetered tariff, the tenant rental charges shall be revised for the duration of the lease to reflect the removal of the energy related charges.

Eligibility for service hereunder is subject to verification by the Utility.

TERRITORY

Within the entire territory served natural gas by the Utility.
