**SUBJECT: ADDITION OF PARADISE MARSH TO THE ELECTRIC AND GAS
PRELIMINARY STATEMENTS FOR HAZARDOUS WASTE SUBSTANCE
CLEANUP**

San Diego Gas & Electric Company (SDG&E) hereby transmits for filing revisions to its electric and gas tariffs as reflected in Attachments A and B, respectively.

PURPOSE

The purpose of this filing is to add Paradise Marsh (aka Gun Powder Point) to the list of Covered Hazardous Substance Cleanup Sites contained in Section VI.B.1.c.(3) of SDG&E's Electric Preliminary Statement and in Section VIII.E.1.c.(3) of SDG&E's Gas Preliminary Statement. This Advice Letter is being filed in compliance with California Public Utilities Commission (Commission) Decision (D.) 94-05-020 in Application (A.) 91-04-044.

BACKGROUND

D.94-05-020 established a new procedure for the recovery of electric and gas hazardous waste cleanup program expenses. The procedure applies to manufactured gas plant sites, presently identified Federal Superfund sites, and other sites identified by the utilities. In addition, SDG&E may add sites to the procedure by filing an advice letter requesting such treatment which provides the following information: 1) name of the site; 2) location of the site; 3) the source, nature, and approximate date of the contamination; 4) utility operations (historic and current) at the site, if any; and 5) environmental agency actions and oversight regarding the site, if any. The ability to add sites to the procedure was confirmed by Commission Resolution E-3419.

The relevant information for Paradise Marsh is as follows:

1. Name: Paradise Marsh properties
2. Location: APNs 5650100800 and 562300200, Chula Vista, California

3. Source, Nature, and Approximate Date of Contamination: The property was purchased by SDG&E in 1958 and has been used as a corridor for Electric transmission and distribution lines and Natural Gas Transmission. Prior to SDG&E purchase, the property was impacted with burn ash and trash from an unknown source. The area and surrounding properties are designated as a closed dump site by the County of San Diego Department of Environmental Health Local Enforcement Agency.
4. Utility Operations (historic and current): The property was purchased by SDG&E in 1958 for the transmission line easement from the South Bay Power Plant to the San Diego area prior to construction of the South Bay Power Plant. The Site is located in the incorporated Chula Vista city.
5. Environmental Agency Actions and Oversight: San Diego County Department of Environmental Health Local Enforcement Agency has closed Landfill jurisdiction and oversight under Title 27 of California Code of Regulations.
6. Costs: The closed burn ash landfill cleanup costs that SDG&E is seeking to recover through the procedure are not being recovered through base rates or through any other recovery procedure. All cleanup costs included by SDG&E in the procedure will be hazardous and non-hazardous waste cleanup costs found appropriate for recovery in the Hazardous Substance Cleanup Cost Recovery Collaborative Report, dated November 19, 1993.

This filing will not increase any rate or charge, cause the withdrawal of service, or conflict with any rate schedule or rule.

EFFECTIVE DATE

SDG&E believes that this filing is subject to Energy Division disposition and should be classified as Tier 2 (effective after staff approval) pursuant to GO 96-B. Therefore SDG&E respectfully requests that this advice letter become effective February 28, 2009, which is 30 calendar days after the date filed.

PROTEST

Anyone may protest this advice letter to the Commission. The protest must state the grounds upon which it is based, including such items as financial and service impacts, and should be submitted expeditiously. The protest must be made in writing and received within 20 days of the date this advice letter was filed with the CPUC. There is no restriction on who may file a protest.
