**SUBJECT: Request to Increase Funding for SDG&E's Neighbor-to-Neighbor (NTN)
Customer Assistance Program**

San Diego Gas & Electric Company (SDG&E) hereby submits for approval the following revisions to its electric and gas tariffs as shown in the enclosed attachment A and B, respectively.

PURPOSE

The purpose of this Advice Letter (AL) is to request California Public Utilities Commission (Commission) authorization to transfer \$1 million from SDG&E's electric Rate Design Settlement Account (RDSBA) and \$0.3 million from SDG&E's Post-2005 Gas Energy Efficiency Balancing Account (PGEEBA) to make available additional funds for the Neighbor-to-Neighbor (NTN) customer assistance program. In addition, SDG&E has created an NTN subaccount within the Core Fixed Cost Account (CFCA) to record any gas entries related to these NTN funds. Southern California Gas Company (SoCalGas) is concurrently making a similar filing.

BACKGROUND

As a result of the current economic conditions, SDG&E is experiencing an increase in calls from customers requesting bill payment assistance. Presently, unemployment rates in California have risen to an unprecedented level of 9.3%. With companies downsizing and families losing their homes, SDG&E's gas and electric customers are experiencing difficulties paying their gas and electric bills.

In an effort to respond expeditiously to customers' concerns in this economic climate and to alleviate the impact of their bills, SDG&E is seeking authorization to increase the funds currently available in its electric NTN program, a subaccount within its Electric Distribution Fixed Cost Account (EDFCA), to provide temporary relief to those electric customers in need of assistance. Furthermore, SDG&E is seeking authority to create a new NTN subaccount within its CFCA to

record entries related to the distribution of gas-related NTN funds for SDG&E's gas customers in need of assistance.

The purpose of the NTN program is to help pay the energy bills of customers who are experiencing temporary financial hardships and are not eligible for state or federal energy assistance. In 2007 and 2008, the total assistance was \$398,393 and \$376,078, respectively.

Under the current proposed NTN program, qualified customers in need of assistance will be eligible to receive up to \$200 to help subsidize their unpaid gas and electric bills. Factors taken into consideration may include unusually high consumption due to life support equipment. If approved, a voucher may be written for up to \$400 in assistance. SDG&E communicates this program to customers in the customers' monthly billing statement.

Customers are notified to call the three-digit number 2-1-1 number from most land lines where they will be assisted by the Customer Assistance group.¹ The agency will screen the customer to determine eligibility and will be referred to the appropriate program. Customers calling from a cell phone or from their work place will be referred to (858) 300-1211. Request for Increase in Funding

In this AL, SDG&E requests approval to transfer a total of \$1.3 million, \$1 million from the RDSBA and \$300,000 from the PGEEBA, to provide additional funds and expand SDG&E's NTN program to assist customers who are experiencing financial hardships. The RDSBA records the credits and revenues attributed to the 2006 Rate Design Settlement Component approved in D.05-12-003². The balance in the RDSBA account currently is an overcollection which SDG&E feels can be used to provide additional funds to the NTN program and be transferred to the NTN subaccount within the EDFCA. Similarly, SDG&E's PGEEBA has unspent and uncommitted 2008 funds available for transfer. Overcollected revenues from PGEEBA will be transferred to the newly created NTN subaccount, within the CFCA, to record any gas entries related to the NTN program. Utilizing these overcollections, as proposed, will offer SDG&E the opportunity to assist more customers who are experiencing difficulty paying their gas and electric bills. Unspent funds currently available for NTN funding, previously granted in E-4030, will be applied first before additional funding is utilized.

¹ 2-1-1 is the dialing code for free, 24-hour community, health and disaster information in San Diego County. 2-1-1 has been set aside by the Federal Communications Commission for the public to easily access community information. Callers receive personalized information from a live phone specialist who can answer questions about a variety of services and information.

² CARE customers contribute to the RDSBA and to any overcollection for any usage above 130% of baseline. Any overcollection existing at year-end in the RDSBA will be applied to both CARE and non-CARE customers for usage above 130% of baseline.

In addition to the account transfer request detailed above, SDG&E shareholders will contribute \$150,000 to the NTN program. It is SDG&E's intent to use this shareholder donation prior to utilizing any transferred balances.

Should SDG&E need additional funds to assist customers; an advice letter similar to this request will be filed seeking Commission approval. However, if excess funds exist and there is no longer a need for the use of these funds in this customer assistance program in the near future, SDG&E will address the disposition of the balance in connection with its annual regulatory account update filing.

The NTN program is one of several assistance programs that SDG&E provides its customers. SDG&E will continue to offer and communicate its currently existing services such as the California Rates for Energy (CARE) program, Family Rate Electric Assistance (FERA) program, Medical Baseline program and the Low Income Energy Efficiency program. SDG&E also informs its customers that they might also be able to receive bill and home weatherization assistance through the California Department of Community Services and Development's Low Income Home Energy Assistance Program. Taken as a whole, these programs provide SDG&E customers with several resources for assistance.

This filing will not increase any rate or charge, cause the withdrawal of service, or conflict with any rate schedule or rule.

EFFECTIVE DATE

SDG&E believes this filing is subject to Energy Division disposition and should be classified as Tier 2 (effective after staff approval) pursuant to GO 96-B. SDG&E respectfully requests that this filing be approved effective March 22, 2009, 30 days from the date filed.

PROTEST

Anyone may protest this Advice Letter to the California Public Utilities Commission. The protest must state the grounds upon which it is based, including such items as financial and service impact, and should be submitted expeditiously. The protest must be made in writing and must be received within 20 days of the date this Advice Letter was filed with the Commission. There is no restriction on who may file a protest. 6. Energy Payment Deferral Plan for Citrus and Agricultural Growers

Resolution E-4065 authorizes an Energy Payment Deferral Plan to provide relief to growers' whose crops were destroyed by frost damage in January 2007. It permits growers to defer up to 50% of their billings from February 2007 through January 2008 associated with citrus and other qualifying agricultural production without incurring interest charges. Beginning February 2008, growers will be billed the accrued deferral in up to twelve equal monthly installment payments. The Utility is authorized to recover the monthly administrative costs and any uncollected deferred billings.

7. Accounting Procedure:

The Utility shall maintain the EDFCA by making entries at the end of each month as follows:

- a. A debit entry equal to the pro rata allocation of the authorized distribution base margin revenue requirement (reflecting the factors in Section 4 above), net of franchise fees and uncollectible expense.
- b. A credit entry equal to the monthly billed distribution base margin revenue, net of franchise fees and uncollectible expense.
- c. A debit entry equal to the incremental administrative costs and any amounts written off as uncollectible as a result of the 2007 citrus and other agricultural growers' Energy Payment Deferral Plan.
- d. An entry equal to interest on the average balance in the account at the beginning of the month and the balance after entries 7.a through 7.c above, at a rate equal to one-twelfth of the interest rate on three-month Commercial Paper for the previous month, as reported in the Federal Reserve Statistical Release, H.15, or its successor publication.

8. Account Disposition

The utility shall file in October of each year an advice letter requesting to amortize the projected EDFCA year-end balance in the electric distribution rate effective January 1 of the following year.

9. Neighbor-to-Neighbor Account (NTNA)

Purpose:

Pursuant to Resolution E-4030, the purpose of the (NTNA) is to record a portion of the EDFCA balance to provide funding to the Neighbor to Neighbor Program.
